Youth Options

Racine Unified School District students enrolling in the Youth Options Program will adhere to all requirements established in the Wisconsin Statute.

When conflict occurs in class schedules, the high school schedule will be considered primary. High school counselors will coordinate schedules.

If the student specifies that he/she intends to take a course at an institution of higher education for high school credit, the Board of Education shall determine whether the course is comparable to a course offered in the school district, including Racine Virtual Learning Academy, and whether the course satisfies any of the high school graduation requirements under s.118.33, and the number of high school credits to award the student for the course, if any.

The Board of Education shall notify the student of its determinations, in writing, before the beginning of the semester in which the student will be enrolled as to whether Youth Options request(s) have been approved or not.

~~Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, S~~students shall be limited to eighteen (18) post-secondary credits total in their junior and senior years.

~~Equipment associated with the course, which will become property of the student, is the financial responsibility of the student. Books and equipment paid for by the District must be returned to the Youth Options Administrator at the completion of the course. Reimbursement for the costs of items not returned will be charged to the student's account. Students who are in the Class of 2005 shall be "grandfathered" and shall not be limited by this requirement.~~

The school district may seek reimbursement from the parent/guardian or the student if he/she is an adult for any class that a student drops or fails under the Youth Options Program.
